30 **WELCOME AND APOLOGIES**

JF welcomed everyone to the meeting

Apologies had been received from Mrs G Brown

31 STUDENT COUNCIL

The student council visited the LGB to talk about the work they are doing as well as what made them want to be on the student council

Q: (JF) How did you become a student council member?

TSC: We filled in a voting form and then spoke to our class about what we had written. Each class member votes for 2 students and the students with the highest votes were elected Q: (NL) Why did you volunteer to be a student council member?

TSC: It's a good experience and we are more involved in the school. We like to help others and listen to others

Q: (DB) I have heard you have 5 student council values. What are they?

TSC: They are kindness, curiosity, courage, respect and behaviour

Q: (DB) How do you make sure these values are being monitored in school?

Q: (SA) What projects do you have planned for this year?

Reading

C: (DB) Greater depth has made progress but expected is not as good

C: (MC) It's the cohort. We have tracked them through the school. Small cohorts can vary the data greatly

C: (VW) We must also be mindful the 2025 data is just from the first mock

O: (JF) How big was the 23/24 cohort?

MC: 29, 10 more than this year

C: (VW) The effort the children have put in and the quality of teaching and learning has greatly improved

Q: (SA) What would you consider 'usual progress'?

MC: Around 2-3 scale points and we have a pupil who has gone up by 8 already

Q: (JF) You've had a big push on reading and the library has been revamped – what is the impact of these?

VW: It's significant, they have to have a wider knowledge to be able to access reading. There is a serious shift in the building as to where reading can take you

Writing

C: (MC) We were moderated in 2022, handwriting is an issue. We have none at greater depth C: (VW) We are working hard to ensure those struggling with handwriting and the barriers don't fail

Q: (JF) Are you expecting any greater depth in writing?

VW: Not yet. CUSP is split into Block A and Block B. Block A has a high level of scaffolding (support) in place. Block B will show us more when the children have to recreate what they have learnt in Block A

GPS (Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling)

C: (VW) This is a tough test and requires very careful punctuation

C: (JF) GPS links to reading and writing. You've got high achievers in reading but not writing

C: (VW) One pupil is definitely capable of greater depth in writing but we are not there yet

MC left the meeting at 18:30

Maths

C: (VW) We have 10/19 at national with another 3 in the high 90's

Q: (DB) How do you compare to the other trust primaries?

VW: I haven't looked as we all have massively different cohorts and cohort sizes

37 HEADTEACHER QUALITY ASSURANCE SUMMARY REPORT – PRACTICE AND RETRIEVAL

JOB gave an overview of TCAT's T&L framework, setting out its purpose and key objectives. A copy of the framework was included in the Board papers for reference

At KPS, Practice and retrieval includes:

- Flashback 4 assemblies each week
- Retrieval activities at the start of every lesson
- The use of Curriculum Keys

SLT regularly complete learning walks and learner voice and monitoring, through these, helps inform the quality of the practice and retrieval across the school

Monitoring has shown retrieval practices are embedded across all year groups

- C: (VW) As Headteachers we are not there to judge but to measure impact
- C: (IC) It's good that you can choose one specific aspect to focus on
- C: (VW) Staff always know the reason for the class visit and the focus is on the children, not the teacher
- Q: (DB) Retrieval practices are secure, but the report goes on to say they are not consistent? VW: What we do is secure. The depth of the answers the children will give is what differs and it's not based on age
- C: (JF) The framework is clearly embedding itself. During a recent visit, the children were able to tell me when they learnt a specific topic
- C: (SC) It's good as I can seamlessly incorporate it into EYFS

38 SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT PLAN - PROGRESS AND IMPACT

The KPS development priority for this academic year is

Our "universal offer" of an exceptional curriculum and enrichment programme is accessed, applied and enjoyed by every child in the school and contributes to further improved academic outcomes

Actions include

- Continuous review and refinement of the curriculum
- Further embed purposeful talk across the school
- Development of the reading culture

Q: (JOB) You use CUSP in some subjects but not others, are DT and Writing working well? VW: Yes. We originally used an alternative to CUSP due to pedagogical delivery and our initial thoughts were that it would be too much of a change for staff. However, they are now all on board and outcomes are good

Q: (DB) When it comes to vacancies, how do we stop it defaulting to you?

VW: MC stepped in just before Christmas and we spoke at length about this in January. MC can now take over if necessary. I attend so many meetings so my teachers can be in the classroom Q: (DB) How do weave that into the SDP, evidence it?

VW: Target 3 is testament to the distance travelled in distributed leadership

Q: (SA) When is the next staff survey due?

JOB: The Trust surveys are biannual, and one will be going out this year

C: (VW) We conducted one in the summer as well as Ofsted and both were very positive
